The Adrienne Weaver Children's Fund for Science was established in 1999 in honor of Adrienne Weaver by her friends and family. Adrienne devoted 30 years of her professional life to teaching in Seattle Public Schools and was passionate about teaching science to elementary school students. She was a lifelong gardener and found enormous pleasure working with kids, animals, plants and tide pools.

Award Overview

The Adrienne Weaver Science Teaching Award honors a K-8 teacher in Seattle Public Schools who inspires students in the natural sciences (e.g. biology, environmental and life sciences). This award also seeks to recognize a teacher who collaborates with colleagues to integrate science throughout the curriculum and the school community.

The award recipient will receive a \$2,500 grant for supplies, professional development, or other expenses related to inspiring students in science.

Eligibility

- Teachers in grades K 8 who have been with the district at least three years
- Teachers from schools where, for at least two of the past three years, the percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-lunch is 40% or higher (see list on page 2)
